READY-TO-GO BOOK DISCUSSION FOR:

GABRIEL FINLEY & THE RAVEN'S RIDDLE

- Before the discussion, if there are new members, ask all participants to introduce themselves, stating age/grade and whether or not they have ever talked about books in a group setting before.
- Below are some possible discussion questions, but always ask participants what questions they think should be discussed.
 - 1. Did you like the book? Why or why not?
 - 2. Who is your favorite human character?
 - 3. Who is your favorite avian character?
 - 4. Which of the children are you most like? What qualities do you share? Who are you least like?
 - 5. Is Gabriel brave? Is he the bravest of the children in the book?
 - 6. What is the turning point of the novel?
 - 7. This is Mr Hagen's 3rd novel, although his first for kids. Do you think he has successful transitioned to writing for adults to writing for youth?
 - 8. It is obvious why Gabriel wants to find his father, but why do you think each of the other children choose to join him on his journey?
 - 9. What is the difference between a raven and a valraven?
 - 10. How does a raven become a valraven?
 - 11. What should you do if a valraven asks you a riddle? Why?
 - 12. What does it mean to paravolate? Do you think this is a real word?
 - 13. Would you like to have a magical connection with an animal? If so, which animal and what would you be able to do together?
 - 14. What is the significance of turning 12 for Gabriel?
 - 15. What does Gabriel learn from his father's diary?
 - 16. What is the importance of the desk? Did you like it or think it was weird, silly, ridiculous or fabulous?
 - 17. What are the similarities between Gabriel and Paladin's lives?
 - 18. Even though this is quite a serious story, there are many silly/funny scenes. Which parts did you find funny?
 - 19. Why do you think George Hagen chose birds to play such an important role in his story?
 - 20. Explain the power of the torc.
 - 21. Riddles and puns appear throughout the text. Were you able to solve them all or do you just skip past them?
 - 22. Do you believe that Corax is dead?
 - 23. Did you like the ending? What about it makes you think there will be a sequel?
 - 24. What do you think the 2nd book will be about?
