Alexander, Kwame with Mary Rand Hess. *Solo*. HarperCollins, 2017. \$17.99. ISBN: 978-0310761839.

Blade is the rich and famous son of a rich and famous- but washed-up- rock star dad. He would rather be anywhere else, since he doesn't feel like he belongs in a family now known for drugs, violence, and media scandal. When a long-hidden secret comes to light, Blade seeks answers in Ghana and finds truth in the music.

 Tina (aka Tiny Girl) and her friends try to figure out who murdered her mother in this mystery set in a fictional Kenyan city. You'll be rooting for Tina as she navigates through the world of illegal arms trading and encounters refugees escaping the conflict in Congo.

Grace has always known she's adopted and loves her family fiercely, but when she puts her own baby up for adoption, suddenly knowing her bio family is more important than ever. Younger bio sister Maya and older bio brother Joaquin enter Grace's life with their own family secrets and join her in the search to find their mother. Each sibling grapples with their own family demons while learning to come together as a team in this beautiful and heart-warming story.

She missed this: friends, family, and her brother Lion. However, things back home aren't as she remembers them and Suzette has some new secrets of her own to grapple with while trying to fit back in.

Each character regales readers with their version of the fated mythical event of King Minos and his twisted labyrinth. Perfect for fans of Percy Jackson, poetry, or just plain drama!

After failing his final time-traveling exam, Far McCarthy takes a position commanding a ship with a crew of his friends as part of a black-market operation to steal valuables from the past. But when they make a big discovery about the universe, they'll have to figure out how far they're willing to travel to save themselves and the world.

Naomi is a solider, and her mission is protecting her planet from the environmental disaster that Earth will wreak if it takes control. Abel is the most advanced machine ever built, abandoned for years in space. They are enemies, but when fate forces them together, they begin to question everything they've been taught. Are they willing to make the ultimate sacrifice to end the interstellar war?
