

FiberConnect Library Speed Tests

- 1. To further assess the status of the FiberConnect project, the Vermont Department of Libraries would like to collect speed data from all 43 participating libraries. We ask you to conduct speed tests at least two times on two days each week (same days and times). Try to select days and times when you believe that Internet use is consistently high. For example, conduct tests at 10:00 AM and 4:00 PM every Tuesday and Friday. Please record speed data from your library at a page on the Vermont Department of Libraries website, found here: http://libraries.vermont.gov/fiberconnectspeedtest.
- 2. You'll enter all the identifying information on the form as well as speed test data. To obtain the data concerning the speed of your connection, click on the link to the "Speedtest.net" website (see below):



3. That link will bring up this website:



- 4. Click on BEGIN TEST.
- 5. When the test is completed, your results will be displayed.



- 7. Make note of both "download speed" and "upload speed" and return to the tab or window that displays the form where you started in step 2.
- 8. Record the download and upload numbers from the speed test on the form, complete all other parts of the form and click on the Submit button.
- 9. Test results for all libraries on the VTLIB WAN will be posted at least quarterly on the VT FiberConnect web page: http://libraries.vermont.gov/fiberconnect
