Abstract:

The Department of Libraries (VTLIB) has a strong interest in supporting continuing education and professional development opportunities for Vermont library workers. This is especially true since in Vermont's 183 public libraries there have only 66.24 FTE employees with an MLS degree. In 2013 the VTLIB made available six scholarships (\$1300 each, though one of them used only \$892.90) to attend the fall conference of the Association for Rural and Small Libraries (ARSL) in Omaha Nebraska, held September 25-28, 2013. The six applicants were selected in a competitive application process and were required to attend conference programs, network with their peers from other states, and share their experiences and learning with other Vermont library workers via a written report and participation in a continuing education activity in Vermont. The six attendees were accompanied by a Vermont Department of Libraries' consultant who also attended the conference.

List any important findings or outcomes from your project:

Attendees were overwhelmingly positive in their reports on attending the ARSL conference, citing high value found in attending programs led by well-known speakers and their colleagues from across the nation, and getting to know the other Vermont librarians from regions other than their own. The VTLIB regional consultant who accompanied them provided an important role, giving them background, context and counsel. In addition to their written reports, the attendees presented as part of a VTLIB webinar to explain what they learned, how it will help them in their jobs and why they found participation in a professional conference such a positive experience for them and for their libraries.

Please briefly describe importance of findings.

This is the second round of ARSL scholarships for staff in small, rural libraries, made poissble with LSTA funds. Attendees continue to be among the more active librarians in our state, open to innovation and willing to try new ideas. They continue to step up to initiatives such as EDGE Benchmarks and can be counted on to participate in professional activities throughout the state. VTLIB will again offer scholarships in 2014 in the belief that attendance at the ARSL annual conference is beneficial to the communities represented by these librarians and to the profession statewide in the building of new leaders.

Once librarians in small Vermont libraries complete the Vermont Department of Libraries' Certification Program, they have fewer professional development opportunities -- or occasions to meet with their colleagues in other regions of the state. Library Directors may attend county meetings; VTLIB also seeks to sponsor events in Vermont where librarians from small (including one-person) libraries can learn from and share with those in like-sized or otherwise similar libraries outside their own regions. Most scholarship recipients have never attended a national library conference and they return to Vermont energized and inspired.
