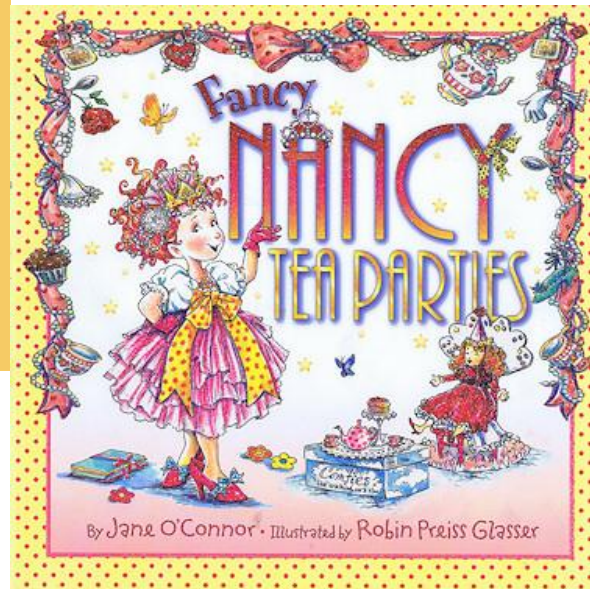
Adult Craft Night

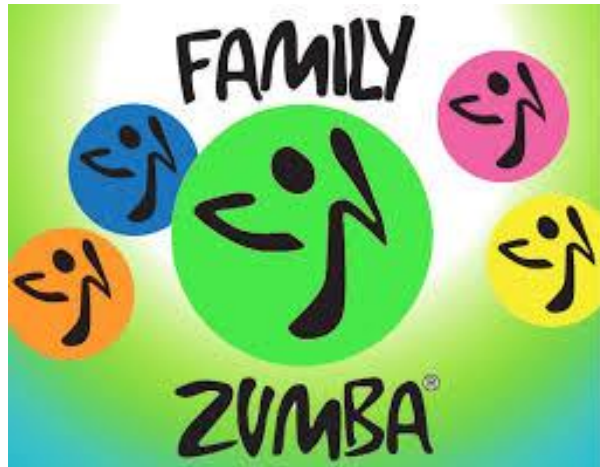
