INTRODUCTION

This report reflects data collected from 152 public libraries based on their last fiscal year completed between December 31, 2014 and October 15, 2015. The data was reported voluntarily by the individual libraries to the Vermont Department of Libraries via an online survey. Because not all libraries submit data each year, the totals and percentages reported here may be somewhat incongruent with statistical reports from prior years.

Below are listed some statewide indicators comparing FY2015 with the previous year's report:¹

- ❖ **Libraries reported a decrease in the total number of hours they are open** to the public.
(FY2014: 4,838 / FY2015: 4,720) (-2.44%)
- ❖ **Visits to libraries decreased** by 78,462. (FY2014: 3,218,154 / FY2015: 3,139,692) (-2.44%)
- ❖ **Local tax appropriations increased** by \$1,021,136.
(FY2014: \$17,366,347 / FY2015: \$18,387,483) (+5.88%)
- ❖ **Other income from all sources (e.g., fundraising, donations, and interest income) increased** by \$453,945. (FY2014: \$3,895,037 / FY2015: \$4,348,982) (+11.65%)
- ❖ **Total income from all sources increased** by \$1,475,827.
(FY2014: \$21,261,384 / FY2015: \$22,737,211) (+6.94%)
- ❖ **Libraries received less grant money** this year. Total grant funds received decreased by \$288,053. (FY2014: \$599,467 / FY2015: \$311,414) (-48.05%)
- ❖ **Total payroll expenditures (salary + benefits) increased** by \$1,204,600.
(FY2014: \$14,681,351 / FY2015: \$15,885,951) (+ 8.20%)
- ❖ **Book (print) expenditures increased** by 1.66% (FY2014: \$1,369,684 / FY2015: \$1,392,474), with an overall **increase in total collection expenditures** (all media) of \$60,690.
(FY2014: \$2,305,698 / FY2015: \$2,366,388) (+2.63%)
- ❖ **Other expenditures decreased.** These expenditures (utilities, fuel, maintenance, etc.) decreased by \$99,573. (FY2014: \$5,307,533 / FY2015: \$5,407,106) (-1.88%)
- ❖ **Libraries decreased the number of physical books** in their collections by 74,276.
(FY2014: 2,711,458 / FY2015: \$2,637,182) (-2.74%)
- ❖ **The number of registered borrowers increased** by 13,456.
(FY2014: 299,691 / FY2015: 313,147) (+4.49%)
- ❖ **Total reported circulation of all items decreased** by 187,572.
(FY2014: 4,313,590 / FY2015: 4,126,018) (-4.35%)
- ❖ **Libraries offered** 936 more programs this year. (FY2014: 23,255/ FY2015: 24,191) (+4.02%)
Program attendance increased by 20,348. (FY2014: 344,842 / FY2015: 365,190) (+5.90%)

❖ **Libraries reduced the number of computers available for public use.** (FY2014: 1,052 / FY2015: 1,036) (-1.52%). Libraries reported a **decrease in the number of weekly computer sessions** (FY2014: 15,520/ FY15: 12,018) (-22.56%) and an **increase in the number of annual computer training sessions.** (FY2014: 39,558 / FY2015: 44,197) (+11.73%)

❖ **Volunteer hours per week decreased.** (FY2014: 3,441 / FY201: 3,138) (-8.80%)

It is thanks to the continuing effort of local librarians that we are able to publish this *Vermont Public Library Statistics, FY2015 Annual Report*. Vermont has 183 public libraries. This report includes statistics submitted by 152 public libraries and is arranged by population served and alphabetically by town. As previously mentioned, data is for individual library fiscal years ending somewhere between December 31, 2014 and October 15, 2015.

Using the data

This publication is designed to help librarians, library trustees, and local communities assess how well their libraries are performing, identify areas for improvement, and make plans for the future. We suggest that librarians and trustees use this data to:

- Identify trends over time, such as increases or decreases in circulation, expenses, or income;
- Compare their own library's data to that of libraries serving populations or having budgets of similar size;
- Inform decision-makers and the local community about the value and importance of their public library.

When reviewing a library's statistics in relation to those of other libraries, it is important to consider context – community demographics, changes in the local economy, events or situations particular to the community, and changes in library services and programs. It is also important to note that Vermont's public libraries and the towns they serve vary a great deal. Some libraries *officially* serve relatively small populations, but *actually* serve larger surrounding areas or significant seasonal populations. Some libraries receive a large tax appropriation, while others serving a similar-sized population rely on interest from endowments or local fund-raising for the bulk of their operating costs. Some "community" libraries (joint school-public libraries) report tax support from both municipal and school sources, while others report only tax support from municipal sources.

It is also important to remember that libraries may count activities and transactions in different ways, and differing local practices and policies have bearing on resulting statistics. For example, some libraries count the number of visitors each day to achieve an annual count; others determine the number of annual visits using a sampling method, making a concerted effort to count daily visitors only during selected weeks in the year. Other factors that have an impact on a library's total circulation are: the number of hours the library is open, length of loan periods (e.g., one month, three weeks, two weeks), methods of renewal of library materials (online, by phone, in-person), the increased use of digital resources such as e-books and downloadable audiobooks, and the inclusion (or exclusion) of uncatalogued paperbacks and other materials in the count.

National sources concerning statistics

These statistics are but one tool in an ongoing self-evaluation process in which all libraries should engage. Good resources for public libraries include: *Say It with Data: A Concise Guide to Making Your Case and Getting Results* (American Library Association, 2014) and *Measuring the Networked Nonprofit: Using Data to Change the World* (JosseyBass, 2012).

Librarians interested in exploring the performance of their children's services will find *Dynamic Youth Services Through Outcome-based Planning and Evaluation* (American Library Association, 2006) helpful. All of these titles are available through interlibrary loan from the Department of Libraries.

Reading the charts in this report

The first chart (p. 13) serves as an index, listing all the libraries alphabetically by town name, and including: library name, population served, facility square footage, number of hours open weekly in winter, and fiscal year end date.

Successive charts are arranged first by population groups and then alphabetically by town name. If a library receives tax funds from more than one town, those populations have been combined as the library's "population served." If there is more than one library in a town, the town's population may be divided among the libraries. For more information, see "Libraries with Adjusted Populations" (p. 11).

The population categories are:

- Public libraries serving populations over 5,000
- Public libraries serving populations between 2,500-4,999
- Public libraries serving populations between 1,000-2,499
- Public libraries serving populations under 1,000

Each population category contains the following charts:

- Staffing, square footage of building, hours open
- Income for the fiscal year (ending somewhere between 12/31/14 and 10/15/15)
- Expenditures for the fiscal year (ending somewhere between 12/31/14 and 10/15/15)
- Holdings of books
- Holdings of other materials
- Services: hours open weekly in winter, registered borrowers, visits, reference transactions
- Circulation and interlibrary loan
- Programming and outreach
- Computers and computer-based services

More extensive definitions of the terms used are included on pages 8 and 9. Readers will also find a brief key displayed at the bottom of each page of the charts. FACTS ABOUT VERMONT PUBLIC LIBRARIES, FY2015

There are 183 public libraries. 152 libraries submitted data this year.

- Vermont ranks first in the nation in the number of public libraries per capita.
- There is also an independent bookmobile that serves Franklin and Grand Isle counties.
- Three public libraries have both “main” and “branch” libraries: Aldrich Public (Barre), Ilsley Public (Middlebury) and Quechee; four libraries have either year-round or seasonal bookmobiles: Cobleigh Public (Lyndon), Dorothy Alling (Williston), Milton Public, and South Burlington Community Library. Fletcher Free Library (Burlington) uses a van for outreach services.
- 605,296 Vermont citizens have access to public library service, available locally or by contract (formal or informal) with another town’s library, 96.59% of Vermont’s total estimated population of 626,630¹

- Vermont public libraries also reported \$311,414 received from grant sources and \$119,292 from non-resident borrower fees.
 - 80.87% of Vermont public library operating funds came from local taxes.
 - 0.46% of operating funds came from state or federal sources.
 - 19.13% came from other local sources, primarily interest on endowments and local fund-raising.
- FY2012: Nationally 84.4% of public library funds came from local taxes, 6.9% from state sources, <1% from federal funds, and 8.3% from other sources.⁵*

FY2012 National average per capita tax support⁶ = \$32.05.

In FY2012 Vermont's average per capita tax support was \$28.80.

In FY2012 Vermont ranked 6th in "other" income per capita (\$6.06).

FY2012 National average operating income per capita = \$37.98⁷

In FY2012 Vermont's average per capita operating income was \$34.92.

StateInc – grant funds received from the Department of Libraries

OtherInc – funds received from interest on endowments and savings, fund-raising, and other local sources. Does not include in-kind support.

TotalInc – total income received from all sources, including local tax, other income, and operating grants, but excludes State Income (grant funds received from the Department of Libraries)

PCTax – per capita tax support, derived by dividing Local Tax by the unduplicated population of all towns served

Grants – total grants received, mostly for operating, from a variety of sources, including the Vermont Public Library Foundation

Fee Rev. – total revenue from non-resident borrower fees, if charged

Town in which library is physically located

Salaries – amount spent on staff salaries during fiscal year

EmpBen – amount spent on employee benefits such as social security, health insurance, retirement, etc. In some cases, tax funds spent on behalf of the library for employee benefits may not be included if they do not come out of the library's operating budget. Every attempt has been made to capture this data.

TotStExp – total staff expenditure, including salaries and employee benefits

CollExp – amount spent on materials in collection, including books, magazines, audio-visual items, and electronic materials (e.g. e-books and downloadable audiobooks)

OthExp – other library operating expenses such as utilities, programming, publicity, building maintenance, etc. Does not include capital expenses.

TotExp – total operating expenditures. Does not include capital expenses.

PCTotExp – total operating expenditures per capita, derived by dividing TotExp by the unduplicated population of all towns served

Capital - capital outlay, usually one-time expenses for building renovation or expansion

Town in which library is physically located

CollExp – amount spent on materials in collection, including books, magazines, audio, video items, and electronic materials (but not including e-books or downloadable audiobooks)

PCCollnExp – per capita collection expenditure, derived by dividing CollExp by the unduplicated population of all towns served

AdBks – number of adult books (print volumes) owned

JuvBks – number of juvenile (children's) print books owned

Books – total number of books (print volumes) owned

PCVols – volumes of books owned per capita, derived by dividing Books by the unduplicated population of all towns served

Town in which the library is physically located

Audio – total number of physical audio items owned. Does not include downloadable audiobooks.

Video – total number of physical video items owned. Does not include downloadable video.

AdSubs – number of adult print magazine subscriptions received, both purchased and as gifts

JSubs – number of juvenile print magazine subscriptions received, both purchased and as gifts

Total holdings – total number of all items owned, regardless of format, including books, other than e-books or downloadable audiobooks

Town in which the library is physically located

Hrs/Wk – hours open weekly in winter

AdBorr – number of adults registered as borrowers

JBorr – number of children (age 0-14) registered as borrowers

%RegBorr – percentage of population registered as borrowers, derived by dividing RegBorr by the unduplicated population of all towns served, and multiplying by 100

Visits – total number of people visiting the library for any reason during the year. Many libraries collect this data using a sampling method.

PCVisits – visits per capita, derived by dividing Visits by the unduplicated population of all towns served

RefTrans – total number of reference transactions during the year. Many libraries collect this data using a sampling method. A "reference transaction" is defined as an information contact involving the knowledge, use, recommendations, interpretation, or instruction in the use of one or more information sources by a member of the library staff.

PCRef – reference transactions per capita, derived by dividing RefTrans by the unduplicated population of all towns served

Hrs/Wk – hours open weekly in winter

AdCirc – number of adult materials circulated during the year

JCirc – number of juvenile (children's) print materials circulated during the year

TotCirc – total number of physical materials circulated during the year

PCCirc – per capita circulation, derived by dividing Circ by the unduplicated population of all towns served

Turnover—Turnover rate, the average numbers of times an item circulated during the year

ILLTo – number of items provided on interlibrary loan to other libraries

ILLRec – number of items received via interlibrary loan from other libraries, including the Department of Libraries, other public libraries, and school, college, and special libraries nationwide. Does not include bulk loans from the Department of Libraries.

Public libraries serving _____ population, 2014-2015 Programs and Outreach

#AdProg – number of programs aimed primarily at adults and sponsored by the library

#JProg – number of programs aimed primarily at children and sponsored by the library. Weekly story hours or any series of programs are counted as separate programs. Young adult programs are counted in this element.

#Progs – total number of programs for all audiences

AProgAtt – number of people who attended adult programs during the year

JProgAtt – number of people who attended children's programs during the year. (This can include adults who attended children's programs.) Young adult program attendance is counted in this element.

ProgAtt – total program attendance

HomeDel – number of deliveries made to individuals' homes during the year

DayCDel – number of deliveries made to child care providers and centers during the year

OtherDel – number of deliveries made to other sites, such as senior meal sites, recreation programs, bookmobile stops, public swimming pools, etc. during the year

Public libraries serving _____ population, 2014-2015 Computer Services

#PCs – number of computers owned by the library (including laptops, tablets and iPads)

#PubPCs – number of computers owned and available for public use (including laptops, tablets and iPads). This may include computers that are also used by staff.

Type/Access – Type of Internet access: High Speed includes DSL, cable, fiber optic, etc.

ElecUsers – number of people using the library's computer resources to access the Internet during a typical week

#Trained – number of staff and members of the public trained to use the library's computer resources during the year

Filtered? – Is Internet access filtered? (Yes, No, Children's Access Only, Unknown)

Many public libraries exclusively serve the town or city in which they are located. Others serve more than one town, and the populations are added together to obtain the “population served.”

Several public libraries receive annual appropriations from neighboring towns and their populations are adjusted to reflect the genuine “population served.”

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING POPULATIONS OVER 5,000

Thirty-one (31) libraries serve populations over 5,000. Statistics for “branch” libraries in East Barre and East Middlebury are also included with the “main” libraries in Barre and Middlebury respectively. Several of these 31 libraries serve more than one town; in those cases, the unduplicated populations of all of the towns that provide tax support are included as the “population served,” the figure used for calculating per capita values. The South Burlington Community Library serves as both public and high school library. This report does not include statistics for the bookmobile which serves residents of Franklin and Grand Isle counties.

Some significant facts:

- These 31 libraries served 335,460 people. 53.53% of Vermonters lived within these library service areas.
- These libraries were open a total of 1,382.0 hours a week, which represented 29.28% of the total time libraries were open statewide.
- There were the equivalent of 46.14 FTE librarians with MLS degrees in these libraries, which represented 71.55% of the total number of librarians with an MLS degree in libraries statewide.
- Volunteers gave 1,309 hours of their time to these libraries, 41.73% of all the volunteer hours donated to libraries in the state.
- These libraries received a total of \$11,680,314 in tax support. This is 63.52% of the total tax revenue reported by public libraries statewide.
- These libraries secured \$1,923,024 in “other” funds, including fund-raising, donations, investment income, and other forms of giving. This represented 44.22% of “other” funds collected statewide.
- These libraries reported expenditures of \$13,604,084, or 59.83% of the total expenditures reported by Vermont public libraries.
- 46.11% (1,363,801) of the books and other items owned by Vermont public libraries were held in the collections of these libraries.
- These libraries reported 2,022,748 visits, 64.43% of the total number of visits to Vermont public libraries. These libraries also reported a collective circulation of 2,617,659 items, 63.44% of the circulation reported statewide.
- In 2014-2015 these libraries held 11,956 programs, with attendance of 201,068. This represented 49.42% of the programs and 55.06% of the attendance statewide.
- Thirty (30) of these libraries reported having a full subscription to the Vermont Online Library: http://libraries.vermont.gov/online_library/VOL
- All 31 of these libraries provided public wireless (WiFi) access.

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING POPULATIONS BETWEEN 2,500 AND 4,999

Forty-one (41) libraries serve populations between 2,500 and 4,999. The Fairfax Community Library serves as both public and school library. Statistics for the Hartford/Wilder “branch library” are included with Hartford/Quechee.

Some significant facts:

- 133,724 (21.34%) of Vermonters lived within these library service areas.
- These libraries were open a total of 1,353 hours a week, which represented 28.67% of the total time libraries were open statewide.
- There were the equivalent of 13.68 FTE librarians with MLS degrees in these libraries, which represented 21.2% of the total number of librarians with an MLS degree in the state.
- Volunteers donated 881 hours of their time to these libraries weekly, 28.07% of all the volunteer hours donated to libraries in the state.
- These libraries received a total of \$3,857,673 in tax support from their towns. This was 20.98% of the total tax revenue provided to all libraries in the state.
- These libraries secured \$1,259,353 in “other funds,” including fundraising, donations, investment income, and other forms of giving. This represented 28.96% of the statewide total of “other” revenue.
- These libraries had expenditures of \$5,179,494, or 21.89% of expenditures in libraries statewide
- 752,253 or 25.43% of the physical items owned by Vermont public libraries were held in the collections of these libraries.
- These libraries reported 581,047 visits, 18.51% of the statewide total.
- These libraries reported a total circulation of 905,775 physical items. This was 21.95% of the total statewide circulation.
- These libraries reported that they held 5,401 programs, which attracted 83,196 attendees. Statewide, this represented 22.33% of the programs and 22.78% of the program attendance.
- Thirty-four (34) of these libraries reported having a full subscription to the Vermont Online Library. http://libraries.vermont.gov/online_library/vol
- Thirty-nine (39) of these libraries reported that they provided public wireless (WiFi) access.

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING POPULATIONS BETWEEN 1,000 AND 2,499

Seventy-six (76) libraries serve populations between 1,000 and 2,499. Cavendish Fletcher Community Library, Chittenden Public Library, South Hero Community Library, and G.M. Kelly Community Library (Wolcott) serve as both public and school libraries.

Some significant facts:

- 111,961 (17.87%) of Vermonters lived within these library service areas.
- These libraries were open a total of 1,647 hours a week, which represented 34.89% of the total time libraries were open in the state.
- There were the equivalent of 5.20 FTE librarians with MLS degrees in these libraries, which represented 8% of the total number of librarians with an MLS degree in the state.
- Volunteers donated 694.9 hours of their time to these libraries weekly, 22.14% of all volunteer hours donated to libraries in the state.
- These libraries received a total of \$2,261,599 in tax support from their towns, 12.30% of the total tax revenue provided to libraries statewide.
- These libraries secured \$996,432 in “other funds,” including fundraising, donations, investment income, and other forms of giving. This represented 22.91% of the statewide total of “other” funds raised.
- These libraries had expenditures of \$3,655,742, or 15.45% of funds spent by libraries statewide.
- These libraries owned 696,042 physical items in their collections, or 23.53% of the items in library collections statewide.
- These libraries reported 463,061 visits, 14.75% of visits made to libraries statewide.
- These libraries reported a total circulation of 512,457 physical items, 12.42% of items circulated statewide.
- These libraries held 5,734 programs, at which there were 66,233 attendees. Statewide, this represented 23.70% of library programs and 18.14% of program attendance.
- Forty-five (45) of these libraries reported having a full subscription to the Vermont Online Library. http://libraries.vermont.gov/online_library/vol
- Sixty-five (65) of these libraries provided public wireless (WiFi) access.

PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING POPULATIONS UNDER 1,000

There are thirty-five (35) libraries serving towns with populations under 1,000. **Seventeen (48.57%) of these libraries did not report any information to the Department of Libraries for FY2015.** Several libraries in this population range serve seasonal populations (e.g., Greensboro, Middletown Springs, North Hero, and Peacham) which makes their populations swell far beyond 1,000 at certain times of the year and may account for their proportionally higher numbers. Lowell Community, Stamford Community, Walden Community, and Woodbury Community* libraries serve as both public and school libraries.

*Note: In FY2016 Woodbury Community Library has separate school and town libraries.

Some significant facts:

- 24,765 (3.95%) of Vermonters lived within these library service areas.
- These libraries were open a total of 338 hours a week, which represented 7.16% of the total time libraries were open statewide.
- There were the equivalent of 1.48 FTE librarians with MLS degrees in these libraries, which represented 2.29% of the total number of librarians with an MLS degree in the state.
- Volunteers donated 252.8 hours of their time to these libraries each week, 8.06% of all the volunteer hours donated to libraries in the state.
- These libraries received a total of \$587,897 in tax support from their towns. This was 3.84% of the total tax revenue provided to libraries statewide.
- These libraries secured \$170,173 in “other funds,” including fundraising, donations, investment income, and other forms of giving. This represented 3.91% of the statewide total of “other” revenue.
- These libraries reported \$764,281 in expenditures, or 3.23% of funds spent by libraries statewide.
- These libraries reported that they owned 145,825 physical items in their collections, 4.93% of the total number of items held in Vermont public libraries.
- These libraries reported 72,836 visits, 2.32% of visits made to libraries statewide.
- These libraries reported that they circulated 90,127 physical items, 2.18% of the total circulation in libraries statewide.
- These libraries held 1,100 programs, at which there were 14,693 attendees. Statewide, this represented 4.55% of the library programs and 4.02% of the program attendance.
- Twelve (12) of these libraries reported having a full subscription to the Vermont Online Library. http://libraries.vermont.gov/online_library/vol
- Seventeen (17) of these libraries reported that they provided public wireless (WiFi) access.
