Year 1- 2017

1. Tin Forest by Helen Ward: In the middle of a dark, lonely wasteland filled with scrap metal, an old man dreams of a lively forest. One day he comes up with an idea to change things.
2. Over and Under the Pond: In this companion to Over and Under the Snow and Up in the Garden and Down in the Dirt, Kate Messner and Christopher Silas Neal bring to life a secret underwater world.
3. Little Red Henry by Linda Urban VT author- “a hilarious tale of what happens when a coddled kid asserts his independence” from Publisher’s Weekly
4. Ragweed’s Farm Dog Handbook by Anne Vittur Kennedy- full of hilarious dog logic that will tell you what you need to know about living a tough life as a farm dog
5. Before We Eat: Farm to Table by Pat Brisson- as a family sits down to enjoy a meal, they consider those who have provided the food from the farmers who plant and tend the seeds to the store clerks who sell the groceries
6. Up in the Garden and Down in the Dirt by Kate Messner and Christopher Silas Neal- Discover what is in the garden full of green and what makes its home in the dirt
7. Over in the Forest, Come Take a Peek by Marieanne Collins Berkes- follow the tracks of 10 woodland animals to learn their ways and behaviors
8. Water is Water by Miranda Paul and VT illustrator Jason Chin- a 2016-17 Red Clover Honor List book; in child-friendly language, the book explains the need to protect the same water that cycles throughout the world
9. School’s First Day of School by Adam Rex and Christian Robinson - the personified school realizes he is not the only one going through first-day jitters
10. Pond by Jim LaMarche- a group of friends discovers a neglected pond in the woods and decides to fix it up together
11. Otters Love to Play by - A 2017-18 VT Red Clover Book award nominee- learn about the otter as you follow it through the seasons
12. Sleep Tight Farm by Eugenie Doyle- find out about the farm seasons from the springs new growth, through the summer’s heat, the fall’s bounty, into winter’s well-earned rest

13. What a Wonderful World by Bob Thiele and George David Weiss with illustrations by Bob Hopgood (as sung by Louis Armstrong)- Illustrations and lyrics celebrate the wonders of nature, loving friends, and the promise of the future in this positive message
14. Salamander Sky by VT author Katy Farber with illustrations by Meg Sodano- this fictional story adds some nonfiction to a wonderful mother / daughter story about a mother and daughter who help migrating spotted salamanders safely cross the road
15. Everything You Need for a Treehouse by Carter Higgins with illustrations by Emily Hughes- time and imagination are what you need
16. Beyond the Pond by Joseph Kuefler- the power of imagination helps this boy to discover that there is a whole world ready to be explored just beyond his ordinary house
17. Outside Your Window: A First Book of Nature by Nicola Davies with illustrations by Mark Hearld- this illustrated treasury of poems reflects children's experiences with their first encounter with nature as they explore the world around them
18. Redwoods by VT author and illustrator, Jason Chin- a boy finds an abandoned book and is transported to California to learn about these giant trees
19. Woodpecker Wham by April Pulley Sayre with illustrations by Steve Jenkins- a variety of woodpecker species encourage learning about their everyday life
20. The Adventures of Beekles: An Imaginary Friend by Dan Santat- an imaginary friend sets out on a journey to find his perfect match in the real world
21. What Do You Do With a Chance by Kobi Yamada with illustrations by Mae Besom- a child realizes that the more chances that come around, the more fascination grows
22. Man Gave Names to All the Animals- by VT author and illustrator Jim Arnosky provides a beautiful illustrated adaptation of Bob Dylan's song
23. Florette by Anna Walker- a celebration of friendship, resilience, and the magic of the natural world
24. Winter Dance by Marion Dane Bauer with illustrations by Richard Jones- animals prepare for winter, but what should the fox do?

25. Hey, Hey, Hay! A Tale of Bales and the Machines That Make Them by VT author Christy Mihaly with illustrations by Joe Cepeda- learn about how hay is made

26. On Duck Pond by Jane Yolen with illustrations by Bob Marstall- a boy and his dog notice things along the path
27. If a Horse Had Words by Kelly Cooper with illustrations by Lucy Eldridge- a friendship emerges in this tale told from the horses's point of view
28. Thunder Underground by Jane Yolen with illustrations by Josee Masse- a poetic look at the world below our feet
29. 10 Things I Can Do to Help My World by Melanie Walsh- simple text and pictures help kids to learn how they can help save their world
30. Ocean Meets the Sky by Terry Fan and Eric Fan- through the use of his imagination, a boy learns about his grandfather
31. A Big Mooncake for Little Star by Grace Lin- learn about the moon's phases from a little girl who nibbles every night on a mooncake
32. All Year Round by Emilie LeDuc- a poetic look at the seasons through the eyes of a child
