In this Program, we'll learn the basics of drawing a figure and making a simple, four-page comic book. They are part of children stories and join us unbidden at our picnics. We will get to examine and learn fun facts about this small but ubiquitous insect that is so much a part of our daily lives.

Build It and They Will Come! This beautiful slide show presentation of Eastern butterflies features the importance of building and maintaining butterfly habitat. If we are to protect our various local butterflies, and the Monarch butterfly, then it is important to have lots of good nectar plants to help feed butterflies, along with plants where female butterflies can lay their eggs. We will discuss what we can do to maintain good butterfly habitat, and we'll learn about butterfly gardens that many schools are building on the Monarch's migration path, from Minneapolis to Corpus Christi.

In addition to exploring habitat, we will learn about the differences between butterflies and moths, and will touch on interesting butterfly facts and behaviors. Did you know that butterflies taste with their feet? Did you know that the Viceroy butterfly looks like the Monarch and is protected by mimicking the Monarch, which is poisonous to birds.

After the slide show, children will create their own amazing butterfly tee shirts. They may bring their own shirt, or purchase shirts from Jerry, at \$4.00 a shirt (heavy 100% cotton white tees).
