National Voter Registration Day

September 17, 2024

- Consider hosting a voter registration drive
- Post to your social media!

Voter Registration 101

- If you are hosting a registration drive:
 - Contact our office for a special link you can use that will allow folks to skip uploading ID. This will help streamline the process.
 - Give your Town Clerk a heads up about your event and make sure to let them know that forms were collected at a drive.
 - Let voters know about My Voter Page!

PAPER

Pros:

- No internet connection needed
- Can be easier to offer assistance
- Can be more accessible
- Can serve more people at once

Cons:

- You are responsible for returning forms to the correct Town Clerk.

ONLINE

Pros:

- No papers to keep track of
- Teaches folks how to access the website
- Automatically gets sent to correct town office.

Cons:

- You need to upload a copy of ID (unless you have our link!)
- You need internet connection

Vermont has same-day voter registration. You can still register and vote today!

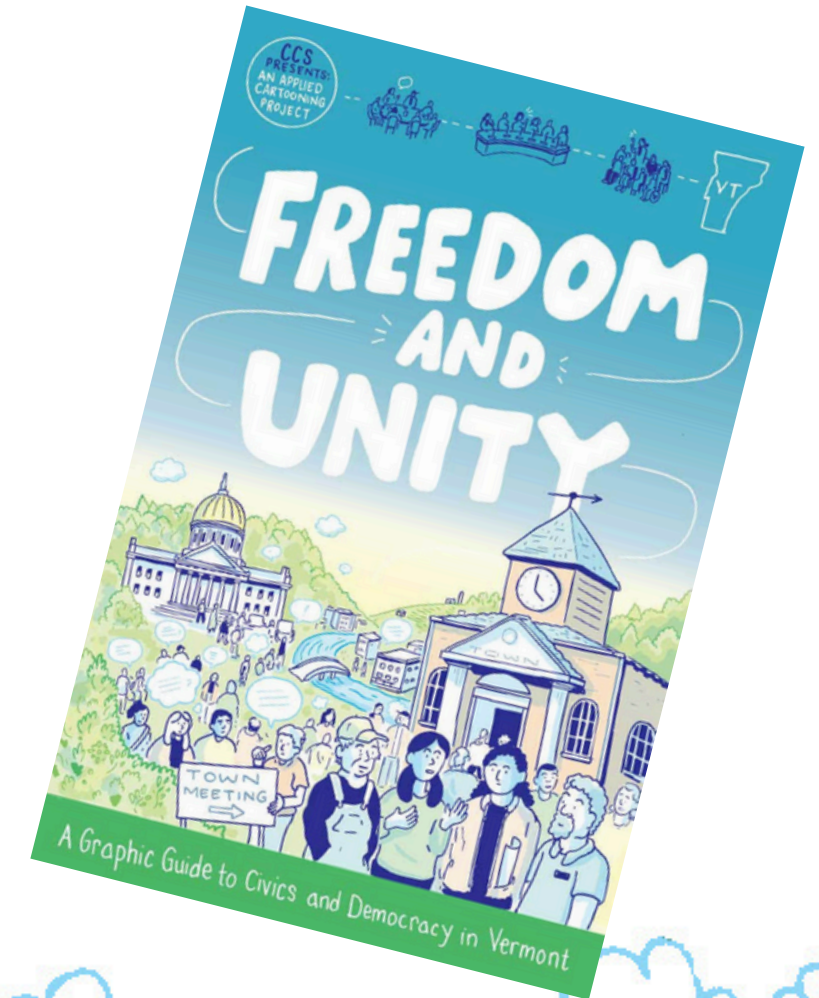
