## INTRODUCTION

- What does your library do well? How do you know?
- How could your library improve? How do you know?
- How does your library's performance compare to that of other libraries in the state?
- Does having a higher materials budget lead to higher circulation?
- It sure felt busy this year, but how can we make a clear case for more staff?

All of these questions can be answered in part by using the statistics your library collects every year. Review your library's statistics over time to see trends such as increased circulation or decreases in non-tax income. You may be able to identify correlations between "inputs" (such as income or number of books owned) and "outputs" such as visits or reference transactions. You may also be able to identify events that occurred in your community or at your library that affected library use, such as library building expansion, grants received, or new senior housing.

### Using comparative data

Beyond reviewing local statistics and trends, you may also want to compare your library's statistics to those of libraries serving populations of similar size. This process may offer clues to your library's strengths and weaknesses and help you evaluate your library's performance in serving its public. It may also suggest reasonable, measurable objectives for long range planning and help you develop and justify a realistic budget.

When comparing your library's statistics to those of other libraries, it is crucial to consider context – community character, library history, and tradition. As you use the statistics in this *Supplement*, remember that Vermont's public libraries and the towns they serve vary a great deal. Some libraries officially serve relatively small populations but actually serve larger surrounding areas or large seasonal populations. Some libraries serving small populations receive large tax appropriations; others serving a similar population rely on interest from large endowments for the bulk of their operating costs. Community libraries (joint school-public libraries) sometimes report tax support from municipal and school sources, while some report only tax support from municipal sources.

In using the data, it is important to remember that some libraries count things in different ways, and differing local practices and policies have bearing on resulting statistics. For example, some libraries count actual visitors each day to achieve an annual count; others count visitors using a sampling method, making a concerted effort to count daily visitors during selected weeks through the year. The latter method may actually result in more accurate statistics. Library loan periods (one month, three weeks, two weeks, etc.), methods of renewal, and the inclusion or exclusion of uncataloged paperbacks all impact on a library's total circulation. *Caveat emptor!*

### National sources about statistics

These statistics are but one tool in an ongoing self-evaluation process that all libraries should engage in. Regardless of size, a useful source of further information on the collection and use of public library statistics is Output Measures for Public Libraries: A Manual of Standardized Procedures, 2<sup>nd</sup> ed. (ALA, 1989).

Some of the information including in this Supplement is broken down by age (adult and juvenile) in response to requests from librarians. Librarians interested in exploring the performance of their children's services will find Output Measures for Public Library Service to Children: A Manual of Standardized Procedures (ALA, 1992) also helpful. Both Output Measures manuals are available on interlibrary loan through the Department of Libraries.

Libraries wishing to find comparative statistics from peer libraries around the country may do so by using the National Center for Education Statistics' Peer Comparison Tool, available at <http://nces.ed.gov/surveys/libraries/publicpeer/>.

### **How this publication is organized**

It is thanks to the continuing effort of local librarians and their staffs that we are able to publish this 2005 annual *Supplement* to the Biennial Report of the Vermont Department of Libraries. This *Supplement* includes most of the statistics submitted by the state's 190 public libraries and is arranged alphabetically by town and by population served. Data is for the fiscal year ending somewhere between December 31, 2003, and June 30, 2004.

The format of this *Supplement* is similar to that of previous *Supplements*. Users should start with the first chart which serves as an index by listing all the public libraries alphabetically by town name. This first chart lists the town, library name, population served, square footage of facility, number of hours open weekly in winter, and when the library's fiscal year ended (this column is blank if the library did not report any statistics in 2004).

Succeeding charts are arranged by population served, based on the 2000 census. In many cases, the population served is a combined population of towns that contribute tax funds to support a library. In other cases, the population of towns served by more than one library has been divided among those libraries, if the population of villages has been determined by the US Census. The population categories are:

- Public libraries serving over 5,000 population
- Public libraries serving 4,999-2,500 population
- Public libraries serving 2,499-2,500 population
- Public libraries serving under 1,000 population

Libraries in each population category are arranged alphabetically by town. Each population category contains the following charts:

- Staffing, square feet of building, hours open
- Income for the fiscal year ending somewhere between 12/31/03 and 6/30/04
- Expenses for the fiscal year ending somewhere between 12/31/03 and 6/30/04
- Holdings - books
- Holdings – other materials
- Services – hours open weekly in winter, registrations, visits, reference transactions
- Circulation and interlibrary loan
- Programming and outreach
- Computers and computer-based services

More extensive definitions of the terms used are included on the following pages, and there is a brief key on each chart.

## 2003-2004 STATISTICAL ROUNDUP

Vermont public library statistics bear out what local librarians were feeling: public libraries were busier in 2003-2004! Grant funds for programs, audio-visual materials, and technology helped to increase circulation and program attendance. Expanded outreach services including new bookmobiles also increased deliveries to individual homes, day care providers, and other community locations.

*Totals and averages are given on individual charts where meaningful.*

### **Vermont Public Libraries, 2003-2004**

**Town** in which the library is physically located (Note: it may serve more towns)

**Library name**

**Population** of town or towns served using U.S. Census, 2000

**Hrs/Wk** – number of hours open weekly in winter

**FYends** – ending date of last completed fiscal year, usually somewhere between 12/31/03 and 6/30/04; “DNR” means the library did not report data in 2004.

**MeetsStds** – whether or not the library meets the minimum standards for Vermont Public Libraries in 2005

### **Public Libraries serving \_\_\_\_\_ population, 2003-2004 staffing**

**Town** in which the library is physically located (Note: it may serve more towns)

**Population** of town or towns served using U.S. Census, 2000

**ALA-MLS** – fulltime equivalent librarians holding a Master’s degree in Library Science from a program accredited by the American Library Assn.

**FTELibns** – number of fulltime equivalents on staff holding title of “Librarian”

**OthStaff** – number of fulltime equivalents on staff not holding title of “Librarian”

**TotFTE** – total fulltime equivalents, based on a 40 hour work week, on staff.

**VolHrs** – number of volunteer hours in a typical week.

**SqFt** – total square footage of library space.

**Hrs/Wk** – number of hours open to the public in a typical week in winter.

### **Public libraries serving \_\_\_\_\_ population, 2003-2004 income**

**Town** in which the library is physically located (Note: it may serve more towns)

**LocalTax** – local tax funds received during fiscal year. This may include funds from more than one municipality. Usually does not include in-kind support such as heat, lights, rent, etc.

**StateInc** – grant funds received from the Department of Libraries

**OtherInc** – funds received from interest on endowments and savings, fundraising, and other local sources. Does not include in-kind support.

**TotalInc** – total income received from all sources including local tax, other income, grants, etc.

**PCTax** – per capita tax support, derived by dividing LocalTax by Population (usually of all towns served).

**Grants** – total grants received, mostly for operating, from a variety of sources, including the Vermont Public Library Foundation/Freeman Foundation, Turrell Fund, Vermont Council on the Humanities.

### **Public libraries serving \_\_\_\_\_ population, 2003-2004 expenses**

**Town** in which library is physically located.

**Salaries** – amount spent on staff salaries during fiscal year.

**EmpBen** – amount spent on employee benefits such as social security, health insurance, retirement, etc. In some cases, tax funds spent on behalf of the library for employee benefits are not included if they do not come out of the library’s operating budget.

**TotStExp** – total staff expenditure, including salaries and employee benefits.

**CollExp** – amount spent on materials in collection, including books, magazines, audio visual items, electronic materials, etc.

**OthExp** – other library operating expenses such as utilities, programming, publicity, building maintenance, etc. Does not include capital expenses.

**TotExp** – total operating expenditures. Does not include capital expenses.

**PCTotExp** – total operating expenditures per capita, derived by dividing TotExp by Population (usually of all towns served).

**Capital** - capital outlay, usually one-time expenses for building renovation or expansion

**Public libraries serving \_\_\_\_\_ population, 2003-2004 book holdings**

**Town** in which library is physically located

**CollExp** – amount spent on materials in collection, including books, magazines, audio visual items, electronic materials, etc.

**PCCollnExp** – per capita collection expenditure, derived by dividing CollExp by Population (usually of all towns served).

**AdBks** – number of adult books (volumes) owned.

**JuvBks** – number of juvenile (children's) books owned.

**Books** – total number of books (volumes) owned

**PCVols** – volumes of books owned per capita, derived by dividing Books by Population (usually of all towns served).

**Public libraries serving \_\_\_\_\_ population, 2003-2004 other holdings**

**Town** in which the library is physically located.

**Audio** – total number of audio items owned.

**Video** – total number of video items owned.

**ElecForm** – total number of items in electronic format (CD-ROM, computer diskette, etc.) owned for all ages.

**AdSubs** – number of adult magazine subscriptions received, both purchased and as gifts.

**JSubs** – number of juvenile magazine subscriptions received, both purchased and as gifts.

**Subscrip** – total number of magazine subscriptions received, both purchased and as gifts.

**Public libraries serving \_\_\_\_\_ population, 2003-2004 services**

**Town** in which the library is physically located.

**Hrs/Wk** – hours open weekly in winter

**AdBorr** – number of adults registered as borrowers

**JBorr** – number of children (0-14) registered as borrowers

**RegBorr** – total number of people registered as borrowers.

**%RegBorr** – percentage of population registered as borrowers, derived by dividing RegBorr by Population (usually of all towns served), and multiplying by 100. Libraries are asked not to supply these numbers if files have not been purged in the last five years.

**Visits** – total number of people visiting the library for any reason during the year. Many libraries collect this data using a sampling method.

**PCVisits** – visits per capita, derived by dividing Visits by Population (usually of all towns served).

**RefTrans** – total number of reference transactions during the year. Many libraries collect this data using a sampling method. A “reference transaction” is defined as an information contact involving the knowledge, use, recommendations, interpretation, or instruction in the use of one or more information sources by a member of the library staff.

**PCRef?** – reference transactions per capita, derived by dividing RefTrans by Population (usually of all towns served).

**Public libraries serving \_\_\_\_\_ population, 2003-2004 services**

**Hrs/Wk** – hours open weekly in winter

**AdCirc** – number of adult materials of all types circulated during the year.

**ChilCirc** – number of juvenile (children's) materials of all types circulated during the year.

**TotCirc** – total number of materials of all types circulated during the year.

**PCCirc** – per capita circulation, derived by dividing Circ by Population (usually of all towns served).

**ILLTo** – number of items provided on interlibrary loan to other libraries.

**ILLRec** – number of items received on interlibrary loans from other libraries, including the Department of Libraries, other public libraries, and school, college, and special libraries nationwide. Does not include bulk loans from the Department of Libraries.

**Public libraries serving \_\_\_\_\_ population, 2003-2004 programs and outreach**

**#AdProg** – number of programs aimed primarily at adults and sponsored by the library.

**#Jprog** – number of programs aimed primarily at children and sponsored by the library. Weekly storyhours or any series of programs are counted as separate programs.

**#Progs** – total number of programs for all audiences.

**AProgAtt** – number of people who attended adult programs during the year.

**JProgAtt** – number of people who attended children's programs during the year. This can include adults who attended children's programs.

**ProgAtt** – total program attendance.

**HomeDel** – number of deliveries made to individuals' homes during the year.

**DayCDel** – number of deliveries made to day care providers during the year.

**OtherDel** – number of deliveries made to other sites such as senior meal sites, recreation programs, bookmobile stops, swimming pools, etc. during the year.

**Public libraries serving \_\_\_\_\_ population, 2003-2004 computer services**

**#PCs** – number of personal computers owned by the library.

**#PubPCs** – number of personal computers owned and available for public use. This may include computers that are also used by staff.

**Type/Access** – Type of internet access: Dial up, High Speed (DSL, cable, etc.), Not Applicable

**ElecUsers/Wk** – number of people using the library's computer resources (e.g., internet access, public access computers, CD-ROMs, online catalog) during a typical week

**#Trained** – number of staff and members of the public trained to use the library's computer resources during the year.

**Filters?** – Is Internet access filtered: yes, no, children's access only, unknown

## Libraries with adjusted populations, 2005

Several public libraries receive appropriations from neighboring towns annually. Some added supporting towns and some lost them in the past year, and the populations served have been adjusted to reflect increases or decreases. These libraries include:

## **PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING OVER 5,000 POPULATION**

There are 32 libraries serving populations over 5,000 in Vermont. Statistics for branch libraries in East Barre, East Middlebury, and Hartford/Wilder are also included with those of libraries in Barre, Middlebury, and Hartford/Quechee respectively.

Several of these larger libraries serve more than one town, and in most cases, the populations of all of the towns providing tax support are included as the population served and are used for calculating per capita values. Because of additional support from surrounding towns, the libraries in Brandon, Castleton, and Woodstock joined this larger library group this year.

Some significant facts:

- 65% of Vermont's public librarians holding MLS degrees work in libraries serving over 5,000; 57% of all public library staff work in these libraries which also engaged 31% of the total volunteer hours in 2003-04.
- The average per capita tax support for these libraries is \$20.36, with a range of \$2.69 (Jericho) to \$57.35 (Essex Junction). The state average of public libraries receiving tax support is \$15.64.
- The average per capita total expenditure is \$27.15, with a range of \$3.40 (Jericho) to \$55.20 (Woodstock). The state average is \$23.54.
- 44% of the books owned by Vermont public libraries are held in those serving over 5,000. These larger libraries spent an average of \$3.31 per capita on their collections, as compared to the state average of \$3.28.
- 60% of all visits to Vermont public libraries are to those serving over 5,000. These libraries also account for 64% of the circulation and 45% of the interlibrary loans received.
- The commonly-held feeling that libraries that spend a lot on materials reap benefits in circulation is borne out by Middlebury's statistics; the library spent the most on materials - \$7.84 - and circulated the highest number of items per capita - 20.87.
- It is interesting to note which libraries are "net interlibrary loan lenders," those that lend more items than receive them: Barre, Burlington, Colchester, Essex, Essex Junction, Lyndon, Middlebury, Northfield, Williston, and Woodstock, with Essex proportionately far surpassing the rest.

## **PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING 4,999-2,500 POPULATION**

There are 40 libraries serving populations between 2,500 and 4,999 in Vermont. Statistics for the Waterbury Center branch library are included with those of Waterbury Public. The Fairfax Community Library is a "community" library, serving as both a public and a school library. Of this group of libraries, only the North Thetford Library did not submit statistics for the 2003-2004 fiscal year.

Some significant facts:

- 22% of Vermont's public librarians holding MLS degrees work in libraries serving 2,500-4,999, and 20% of all public library staff work in these libraries which also engaged 25% of the total volunteer hours in 2003-04.
- The average per capita tax support for these libraries is \$14.93, with a range of \$0.84 (Westminster West) to \$68.25 (Stowe). The state average of public libraries receiving tax support is \$15.64. Manchester's libraries received tax support for the first time ever in 2003-04, but Butterfield Library in Westminster did not.
- The average per capita total expenditure is \$21.26 for libraries serving 2,500-4,999, with a range of \$3.87 (Westminster West) to \$75.46 (Stowe). The state average is \$23.54.
- 20% of the books owned by Vermont public libraries are held in those serving this population group. These libraries spent an average of \$3.00 per capita on their collections, as compared to the state average of \$3.28.
- 21% of all visits to Vermont public libraries are to those serving 2,500-4,999 population. These libraries also account for 18% of the circulation and 23% of the interlibrary loans received.
- Several libraries serving 2,500-4,999 population were "net interlibrary loan lenders" – Derby, Fairfax, Georgia, Norwich, and Waitsfield - supplying more to other libraries than they requested from other libraries.

## **PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING 2,499-1,000 POPULATION**

There are 77 libraries serving populations between 1,000 and 2,499 in Vermont. 41% of the libraries in the state fall into this category. The Moretown Public Library reopened this year, but did not report data. The library in Ryegate Corner closed. Other libraries not reporting data were in East Burke, Cavendish, Danby, Irasburg, Lunenburg, Lunenburg/Gilman, South Ryegate, and West Windsor.

Some significant facts:

- 7 libraries serving populations between 1,000 and 2,499 are located in school buildings. Combined public-school libraries (“community libraries”) are in the towns of Cavendish, Fairfield, Lunenburg/Gilman, South Hero, and Wolcott, while Chittenden and New Haven maintain separate public and school libraries in the same buildings.
- Less than 1% of Vermont’s public librarians holding MLS degrees work in libraries serving 1,000-2,499, and 17% of all public library staff work in these libraries which also engaged 30% of the total volunteer hours in 2003-04.
- The average per capita tax support for these libraries is \$14.04, with a range of \$0.84 (Concord) to \$158.50 (Killington). The state average of public libraries receiving tax support is \$15.64. Several libraries do not receive any tax support at all, including those in Barnet/McIndoes, Bethel, East Craftsbury, and Newfane.
- The average per capita total expenditure is \$24.93 for libraries serving 1,000-2,499, with a range of \$1.32 (Cornwall) to \$165.96 (Killington). The state average is \$23.54.
- 23% of the books owned by Vermont public libraries are held in those serving this population group. These libraries spent an average of \$3.63 per capita on their collections, as compared to the state average of \$3.28.
- 15% of all visits to Vermont public libraries are to those serving 1,000-2,499 population. These libraries also account for 15% of the circulation and 25% of the interlibrary loans received. "Net interlibrary loan lenders" were libraries in Bakersfield, Brighton (Island Pond), Derby Line, South Hero, and Townshend.

## **PUBLIC LIBRARIES SERVING UNDER 1,000 POPULATION**

There are 40 libraries serving towns with populations under 1,000 in Vermont. 21% of the libraries in the state fall into this category. The smallest populations served year-round by libraries are Guildhall (268), Hancock (382), and Pittsfield (pop. 427). Two libraries are only open in the summer – West Burke (pop. 364) and Plymouth (pop. 555). The libraries in Waterville and Whiting have been inactive for several years. Other libraries not submitting data this year included those in Guildhall, Pittsfield, Tinmouth, Vershire, Walden, and West Fairlee.

Several libraries in this population range serve seasonal populations (e.g., Fairlee, Greensboro, Middletown Springs, North Hero, Peacham) which makes their populations swell far beyond 1,000 at certain times of the year and accounts for their higher percentages of registered borrowers.

Some significant facts:

- Four libraries serving under 1,000 are combined school-public facilities (“community libraries”) – those in the towns of Readsboro, Stamford, Walden, and Woodbury.
- 4% of public librarians holding MLS degrees work in libraries serving populations under 1,000, and 4% of all public library staff work in these libraries. Many are run completely by volunteers who average a total of 340 hours per week.
- The average per capita tax support for these libraries is \$14.39, with a range of \$0.46 (Windham) to \$61.69 (Stamford, a community library). The state average of public libraries receiving tax support is \$15.64. Libraries in West Burke and Tinmouth do not receive tax support although their towns do offer tax support to libraries in neighboring towns (Lyndon and Rutland, respectively).
- The average per capita total expenditure is \$25.43 for libraries serving under 1,000, with a range of \$1.14 (Windham) to \$86.57 (Greensboro). The state average is \$23.54.
- 8.5% of the books owned by Vermont public libraries are held in those serving this population group.
- 3% of all visits to Vermont public libraries are to those serving under 1,000 population. These libraries also account for only 2.5% of the circulation and 8% of the interlibrary loans received. Only the libraries in North Hero and Readsboro loaned more books on interlibrary loan than they borrowed.
