Jamboard Overview

After you click the Jamboard link we sent out, you will be taken here. The following slides will explain the different parts of the Jamboard interface.

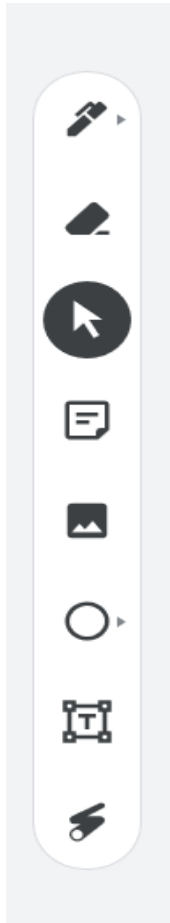


Jamboard Overview – Top Menu



1. Title of Jamboard
2. Go between frames of Jamboard to answer different questions – click the arrows (or, click on the squares to see all of the frames and select which you'd like to go to)
3. Undo button
4. Zoom in or out
5. Set background – do not click this
6. Clear frame – deletes everything, do not click this

Jamboard Overview – Side Menu

1. Pen tool – don't use this

2. Erases pen – don't need this

3. Select button – click to get cursor back

4. Start new sticky note – click and a sticky note will open

5. Add photo

6. Circle tool – don't need this

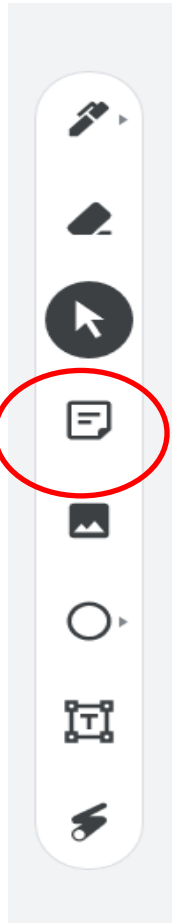

8. Laser tool- don't need this

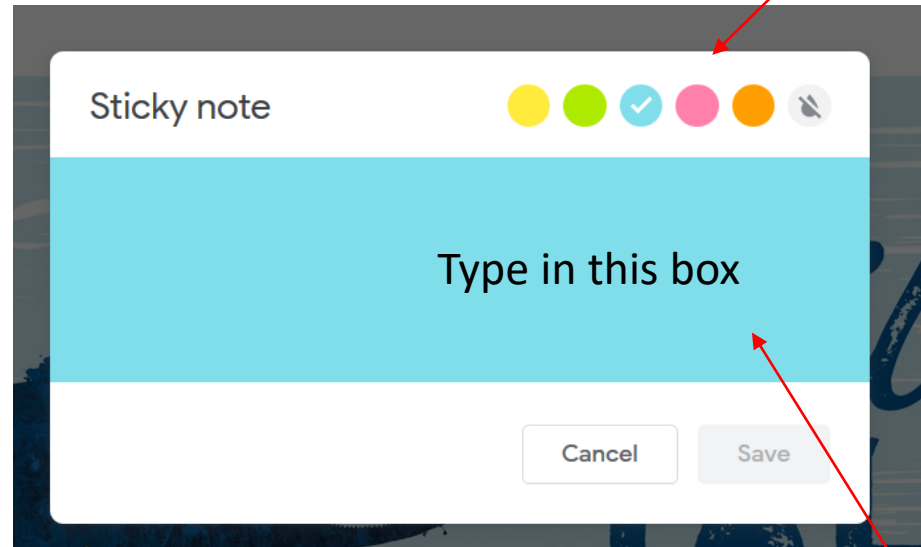
Jamboard Overview – Sticky Notes

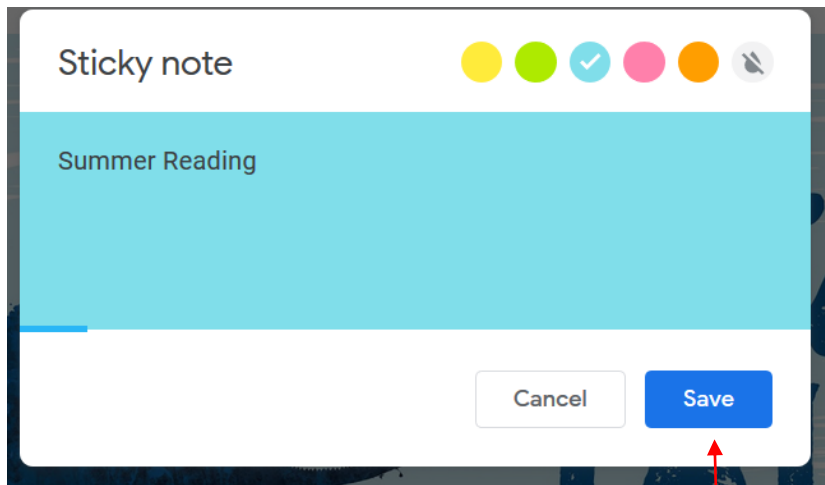
Step 1

You can change the color of the sticky (or click the one on the very right for no color)



Step 2

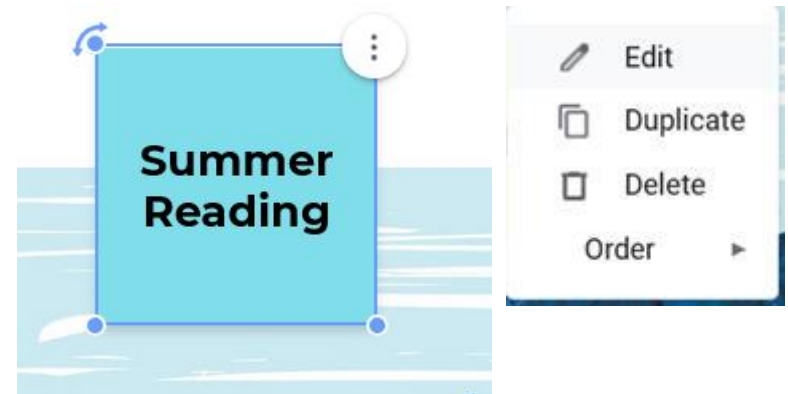
Jamboard Overview – Sticky Notes



When you are finished typing click save. You can then write another sticky or click somewhere else on the screen to get out of it.

Step 3

If you want to delete your note, click on it, and then click on the three dots. You will have an option to delete (or edit)



Click and drag the sticky to move it around the frame.

Step 4

Jamboard activity



- You can make multiple notes for each topic
- Comments can include:
 - Plans for this summer related to the topic
 - Things you have done in the past related to the topic
 - Questions and Concerns related tot the topic
- You may need to move or resize your notes but please don't edit or move other notes
- You can edit your note after you have created it
