# ACT 250 NOTICE APPLICATION 8B0503-3 AND PREHEARING CONFERENCE 10 V.S.A. §§ 6001 - 6111

On July 1, 2020, Poulin Grain, Inc., 24 Railroad Square, Newport, VT 05855 filed an Act 250 application seeking authorization to expand the operating hours of the processing plant/conveyors and deliveries from the currently approved hours of 7:00AM to 7:00PM Monday through Saturday to 4:00AM to 11:00 PM Monday through Saturday. The project is located at 1873 VT Route 67E in North Bennington and Shaftsbury, Vermont.

Pursuant to Act 250 Rules 16 and 20, the Commission is convening a prehearing conference ("PHC") in this matter. A PHC, in summary, has narrow goals and is designed to identify the parties and the issues prior to convening a hearing to evaluate the merits of the case. This project must first be evaluated by the District 8 Environmental Commission ("Commission") in accordance with Act 250 Rule 34(E) – Stowe Club Highlands Analysis, and second in accordance with the implicated criteria of the 10 environmental criteria of 10 V.S.A., § 6086(a). Should the legal thresholds under Act 250 Rule 34(E) be met, the Commission will be afforded the flexibility to evaluate the application on its merits under the criteria. In that event, the Commission intends to narrow the scope of the merits hearing to criteria 8 - Aesthetics (noise) and 10 - Local and Regional Plans, unless that scope is expanded by the Commission at the hearing, to occur at a later date. At the PHC, the Commission intends to pursue limited questioning regarding Rule 34(E), and will be inviting prospective parties, if they desire, to submit relevant filings or rebuttals to Application Exhibit 003 [the Applicant's Rule 34(E) argument]; that invitation will appear in the Prehearing Conference Report and Order ("PHCRO").

The PHC will be followed by the issuance of the PHCRO which will prescribe the preliminary party status rulings, any informational filing requirements, and the scheduling of the site visit and/or hearing. Due to the coronavirus (COVID-19) State of Emergency, and the complications associated with live hearings, parties may waive their right to a live hearing, and instead agree to a process that allows for pre-filing written cross examination and rebuttal documents.

NOTE TO PROSPECTIVE PARTIES: Pursuant to Vermont statute and Act 250 Rules, any person seeking to participate as a party to this proceeding MUST make such a party status request "on or before the first prehearing conference." Accordingly, all prospective parties are obligated to participate, via phone or video, in the PHC scheduled below, or to file in advance a written party status petition to the Commission at the address below. Failure to timely appear on the PHC call or video conference call, or to timely file a written request by date of the PHC, thereafter bars a person from participating as a party in the proceeding, and any such person will thereafter lack legal standing to appeal any decision on this matter made by the District Commission. Due to the coronavirus (COVID-19) State of Emergency, all prospective parties are strongly encouraged to supply an electronic means of communication, such as email, for receiving service of notices on the proceedings.

- 3. **Non-party participants:** The District Commission, on its own motion or by petition, may allow others to participate in the hearing without being accorded party status.

- 3. Documentation that the organization has articulated a position with respect to the Project's impacts under specific Act 250 Criteria.
