Abstract:

Vermont public libraries provide a wealth of programming for adults in local communities and have for many years enjoyed a partnership with the Vermont Council on the Humanities (VHC) to provide scholar-led book discussions and a variety of programs featuring guest presenters in the humanities. In Vermont FY2013 the VHC continued the successful "First Wednesdays" series of outstanding speakers in nine public libraries on topics of the humanities, including history, current events, literature and the social sciences. Speakers in the series include authors, poets, musicians, historians and scholars in a variety of fields, many of whom are known nationally. The Vermont Department of Libraries (VTLIB) again partnered with the VHC to sponsor these programs, held once each month (8 programs scheduled in October-May). LSTA funding provided grants of \$500 to each library and libraries pay the remainder of the local matching funds; the balance is paid by the VHC. In Vermont FY13 VTLIB supported the programs at nine Vermont public libraries in: Middlebury, Brattleboro, Essex Junction, St. Johnsbury, Montpelier, Newport, Norwich, Rutland and Manchester. The VTLIB sponsorship included a payment of \$4000 (state general funds) to the VHC and grants of \$500 (LSTA) to each of the nine libraries to help defray the cost of their programs. Eight libraries each paid VHC \$3000, (including our grant of \$500) to host the series in their towns. The ninth library (Goodrich Memorial Library in Newport) paid \$1750 for the series (including our \$500 grant).

List any important findings or outcomes from your project:

The First Wednesday programs were held October 2012 - May 2013 in nine public libraries. Each library had a different roster of speakers in the series. The average attendance per program across the nine libraries was 77 attendees, but attendance varied month to month from a low average of 65 to a high average of 117. Individual library attendance ranged from 16 ("Ask Us Who We Are") to 220 ("An Evening with Gershwin"). Total attendance for the season was 5,452. Comments from attendees included: "Speaker was engaging and he is such an expert on this history! I learned a great deal and now want to read his book," "[These programs] bring a richness to the community - like nothing else," "I believe firmly in free access to lifelong learning and the 1st Wednesday series is a wonderful example of adult education."

Please briefly describe importance of findings.

Feedback from attendees consistently reaffirms the value of cultural programming to bring people together for learning in public libraries, focused around common interests in the Humanities. Attendance records at each library shows that these programs attract residents of other nearby communities -- and even from other states and Canada.
