Conundrums:

Duplicate records and inadequate records

Getting MARC records for items in different languages with non-roman scripts, accents, special characters, diacritics

Compare, OCLC

Could depend on the way you import a record, uploading vs pulling in from Z39.50 search

How to make a copyright symbol from the keyboard for text documents:

How to make a Copyright C Symbol on a PC Keyboard (©):

This should work for all PC keyboards when you need to type a copyright symbol.

It should work on WYSIWYG html programs when you insert copyright symbols and of course any word processor where you need to make a copyright symbol with your keyboard from standard fonts installed.

Hold down Ctrl and Alt at the same time and press C

Ctrl+Alt+C

©

Hold down Alt and type 0169 on the number pad (right hand side of your keyboard)

Alt+0169 ©
