

Sources of the Law

Constitutions (federal & state) – establish our fundamental rights in respect of government and the form of government. VT Const. chp. 1, art. 1.

Statutes - (federal and state) - laws enacted by Congress or the General Assembly – broadest rules to fit many situations. 15 VSA §1103 (relief from abuse)

Regulations/Rules - laws created by agencies (EPA, Dept of Taxes, Dept. of Families) more specific or detailed rules to help you determine whether you fit within the rule of the statute. CVR 04-000-003 (safe at home address confidentiality).

Case law/common law – the decision of a court as it resolves a controversy between two people/entities (civil law) or a person and a governmental entity (criminal law). *Morton v. Young*, 2023 VT 29 (2023) defines stalking as a course of conduct.

What are Vermont Laws and Where Can I Find Them?

Vermont Constitution	Provides for your most basic rights and the form of Vermont's government. Broadest rules - Apply generally to all VT citizens.	chp. 1, art. 1: All persons are born equally free and independent, and they have certain natural rights such as enjoying life, liberty, acquiring property, and obtaining happiness, and safety.	https://legislature.vermont.gov/statutes/
General Assembly (Statutes)	Enacts/creates statutes. Examples-criminal law, landlord/tenant, wills, probate, guardianships, and divorce Broad rules to cover a range of situations.	15 VSA 1103 allows someone who had been physically or sexually abused, or stalked to seek a protective order against their abuser/stalker. What is stalking? 12 VSA 5131(6) - a course of conduct by a person who knows or should know that their conduct would cause a reasonable person to fear for their safety or cause them substantial distress.	https://legislature.vermont.gov/statutes/ While on this page in the left-hand column headed, "Statutes", you can select "Vermont Statutes at LexisNexis for easier searching.
Administrative Agency (Rules)	Create rules that flesh out statutes to explain more specifically how they are applied. (Dept. of Taxes, Agency of Human Services) Rules help to explain how or if a given situation fits within the requirements of the statute.	CVR (Code of Vermont Rules) 04-000-003 (Agency- Secretary of State) Safe at Home Address Confidentiality Program for victims of domestic abuse, violence, stalking etc. How to apply for confidentiality and requirements to qualify.	https://legislature.vermont.gov/statutes/ Similarly in lefthand column scroll down to "Rules" and select "state agency rules at Lexis" for easier searching.
Judiciary (Opinions/ Orders)	Interprets statutes and rules and applies them to individual fact situations. Decisions can become new law. Most specific - applies to individual situations & facts.	Does a former best-friend (BF) of alleged victim (AV) engage in a course of conduct of stalking by posting a half- naked picture of AV on TikTok, and a video threatening to hurt her, followed by two more videos suggesting that BF still had the photo and might send it others? Held: A threat is an expression of intent to cause physical harm, and here there was only one such threat, which is not a course of conduct. Morton v. Young 2023 VT 29. Low Income:


