

2023 Annual Report

- O The 2023 Annual Report data was collected in early 2024.
- O We received data from 148 of VT's 187 public libraries.
- O Quick reminder Fiscal years vary. Most libraries reported on Jan-Dec 2022, or Jul 2022-June 2023, but a few reported on Jan-Dec 2023 or other periods.

Hours, Visits, and Borrowers

(% changes from 2022)

- Library Hours Open 230,442 (up 3%)
 That total is more hours than 26 all-night convenience stores, open every day of the year.
- Annual Visits 2,136,870 (up 23%)
 This averages out to every single Vermonter visiting libraries more than 3.3 times in a year.
- Registered Borrowers 273,291 (down 1%)
 Ignoring duplication, that's about 42% of the state's population.

Circulation and Usage

- O Physical Circulation 3,046,054 (up 6%)

 That's the equivalent of every single book in Fletcher Free's collection being checked out more than 26 times.
- O eBook/eAudiobook Circulation 724,580 (up 8%) Assuming an average of 3 hours of length, this content provided over 2.1 million hours of entertainment for patrons during their commutes and time in waiting rooms.
- O Database Usage 287,738 (not comparable with 2022)

 Assuming the New York Times publishes 150 original (non-syndicated) articles a day, this would be the equivalent of reading more than 5 years of issues in their entirety.

Interlibrary Loan

- Provided 83,867 (up 7%)
- Received 94,426 (up 7%)
 At \$12.00 per item, it would have cost Vermont libraries over \$1.1 million to purchase these items independently.

Programming

- O Programs (In-Person and Virtual) 26,174 (up 51%)

 If you ran fast enough, you could attend an average of 71 library programs in Vermont every day.
- O Program Attendance 338,888 (up 64%)

 This averages to more than 900 attendees statewide every day of the year.
- Non-Library Sponsored Programs 9,427 (up 30%)
 This averages to more than 181 programs statewide hosted every week.

Items in the Collection

- Print 2,466,905 (down 7%)
 Assuming an average of 1.5 pounds, that would weigh more than 12 blue whales.
- O Physical Video 217,335 (down 3%)
 Assuming an average of 1.5 hours and watching 24 hours a day, it would take you more than 37 years to finish this movie marathon.
- O Physical Audio 102,823 (down 12%)
 Assuming an average of 3 hours of content and 60 mph of speed, you'd have entertainment for a road trip to the moon and back 38 times.
- O Non-Traditional Physical Items 10,213 (down 4%)

 If we imagine these are all puzzles, and assuming it takes four hours to solve one, it would take you more than 4.5 years to complete them all.

Computer Use and Reference Questions

- Public Computer Sessions 155,008 (up 30%)
 That averages out to more than 650 sessions every day of the year.
- O WiFi Sessions 905,664 (Up 21%)

 If patrons had to buy a \$3.00 cup of coffee to use the public WiFi, this would have cost them over \$2.7 million in total.
- O Reference Questions 229,947 (up 7%)

 If you spent 1 minute on each question, it would take you 159 full 24-hour days to answer all of these.

- O Population: 1,853 Ranges from 278 to 44,646 residents
- O Hours Open: 1,612 per year / 31 per week (+19%) Ranges from 255 to 3,016 hours
- Registered Borrowers: 1,055 (+2%)
 Ranges from 141 to 17,288 patrons
- Annual Visits: 5,845 (+28%)
 Ranges from 75 to 193,772 visits
- Reference Questions: 427 (+6%)Ranges from 0 to 27,493 questions

The Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) collects statistics for public libraries nationwide. These stats include all aspects of the library, including finance, collections, circulation, programming, and more. Each year, Vermont public libraries submit their data to the Department of Libraries (read more about that process here). Data is submitted to IMLS, who publishes national data (roughly 2 years behind). The Department makes statewide stats available below.





- This could be in terms of population*, hours open, budget, incorporated vs. municipal, or any other data points.
- 3. From there, you can use a spreadsheet to see how libraries compare.
- 4. You could look at totals or per-capita numbers.
- 5. Based on the results, you can see whether your staffing is out of line with comparable institutions.




